COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to the mystery of Jesus Christ, the living Word of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. In this course students will understand that Jesus Christ is the ultimate Revelation to us from God. In learning about who he is, the students will also learn who he calls them to be.



Course Objectives:


- Explore the concept of Revelation and how God reveals himself to us through Scripture and Tradition, our everyday lives, and creation.
- Understand the concept of the Trinity and how the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are the same but different.
- Explore the mystery of the Incarnation and how Jesus Christ made God's love visible to us in a perfect way.
- Demonstrate understanding of the role of Jesus' mother, Mary, and his disciples in his mission of salvation.
- Reflect on the many ways Jesus' teachings and commandments call us to treat all of creation with respect and enables us to grow in faith.
- Examine Jesus' public ministry as a model for living a life that promotes the dignity of others, forgiveness, and good moral decisions.
- Examine the concepts of the Paschal Mystery and salvation.
- Reflect on what they have learned about discipleship and how one is called to live their life as a disciple of Christ.

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Class Assignments:

Students are expected to complete assigned reading, participate in class discussions, complete daily learning assignments and demonstrate competency on required quizzes and examinations. Assignments turned in after their assigned due date will not be eligible for full credit. **Power School will be updated on Fridays.**
